





- 1. a) In-house: run and support your own Identity Provider (IdP)
 - b) Hybrid: run your own IdP, provided and supported by a third party
- 2. Outsource: e.g. OpenAthens
- 3. Schools: RBCs, LAs







- Resources required in-house
- Full control
- One Access Management solution: internal and external
- No annual subscription fee
- Popular approach



1.b) Hybrid model



- Third party install and deploy IdP at organisation
- Training and Staff development
- Ongoing support
- e.g. Salford Software, Kidderminster College





2. Outsourced

- Minimal effort
- Pass user details to a third party
- Data processing contract required
- Ongoing subscription cost
- e.g. Eduserv





3. Schools

- Independently (in-house approach)
- Through Regional Broadband Consortium or via Local Authority





Participation for Service Providers

- Install Shibboleth Service Provider software
- Obtain X.509 compatible certificate
- No subscription charge







- 103 members (15th September)
- ~ 4 new members / week
- List of services available online
- e.g. Ovid, Atomwide, Elsevier
