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## **DRI AAAI**

- Background & Vision
  - 2019 White Paper "Towards a National UK AAAI Federation"
  - That any eligible and authorised researcher in the UK can:
    - access any research data, computational or experimental system or other resource, whether in the UK or elsewhere
    - in a straightforward, controlled and consistent way that enables access  $\square$
    - whether she or he works in industry, in academe, in the public or the third sector, or is acting as a private individual; and that this
    - provides the assurance and security legitimately required by the owners and providers of those resources, in fulfilment of their missions, and in compliance with their legal, contractual and regulatory obligations.



## **AAAI for DRI**

- SC and STFC have long standing involvement in providing
  - resource accounting
  - topology databases
  - security coordination
  - policy development
- to WLCG, IRIS & others
  - Also in development of EOSC landscape eg AARC projects and AARC Blueprint
- Last summer asked by UKRI office to follow up on 2019 white paper
  - community building
  - update understanding of state of the art based on last 5 years developments



## **DRI AAI & Enabling Services**

### BUT

- This is not primarily a technical problem
- Mostkly about building trust and community to ensure buy in
- Need to understand the many ways these problems are addressed
  - By infrastructures
  - By communities
  - By other countries
- Need to facilitate mapping to UK and UK DRI
- Also, while we have many use cases amongst our own activities, also needs to be accessible (technically and socially) across the UKRI supported DRI

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## **DRI AAI – Gathering user stories**

"as a service provider I'm not sure if I need to formally validate state-issued identities for my users, or how I'm supposed to go about doing this"

"as a funder, I would like to better understand trust and identity risks for the community, and what people mean when they talk about technology sovereignty"

"as a researcher, I'm excited about the potential of agentic AI, but would like to be confident my life's work won't end up as someone else's training data"
